

## **Shellwork**

# Do you know what this design represents?



It is called a Shell Runtee and it was worn on a necklace about 400 years ago. The shell as engraved with this kind of design, often with the six sided leaf pattern. It could represent the sun.


The circle is a common symbol of unity and strength. You can see how our modern-day beaded medallions were derived from such ancient designs.




Shell runtee necklace, Cayuga, Great gully, NY

Shell Runtee. This shell runtee is 1 1/2" in diameter, with a star pattern on both sides. Tiny Squares are incised around the rim. Found from the Sarf Cache site. Luzerne County, pa. Iroquois in origin.












Shell ornaments have enough shape to suggest the bird, animal or amphibian that it represents, with surface decoration of engraved lines and dots. A hole was drilled sideways, through the ornament in order to string it as a necklace.


Erie Woman's Necklace, Ripley, N.Y.














Rafter design, representing a nation of the Confederacy.




